

What is Liturgy?

Have you ever noticed that Lutheran worship tends to follow a kind of pattern or formula? It almost feels a little...predictable? That's not by accident! That's because Lutherans tend to worship according to a liturgy.

"Liturgy" comes from a Greek word mean "public work." It is, literally, the work (and worship!) of the people. When we come together for worship, liturgy is the form that worship takes, and how we, collectively, bring our prayers and praise to God. The service is generally divided into four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. Within those parts are prayers, readings, songs, offerings, and blessings. Some of those things happen every week, while others are more flexible. You can see a pattern for a typical Lutheran liturgy, which forms the basis of our worship, on pages 92 and 93 of the hymnal.
