Holy Trinity Sunday

The first Sunday after Pentecost is Holy Trinity Sunday. It is a unique day in the church calendar, as it is the only day devoted specifically to a doctrinal belief: that God is three persons (Father, Son, Holy Spirit) but still only one God. The three persons of the Trinity are distinct from each other, yet are all equal to one another. People have used many metaphors and images to try to describe the Trinity (a shamrock, a stool with three legs, a fan with three blades, even a dance), but eventually, all these images fall apart. The Trinity is a mystery of faith. And yet, the Trinity is more than just a doctrine or a mystery. The Trinity is a relationship; our God is inherently relational. And we who have been created in God's image are made to be in relationship as well. On this Holy Trinity Sunday, we remember that God relates to us in different ways—as Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier; as Parent, Sibling, and Companion. On this day, we also remember that we are meant to do likewise, trusting God to empower us to build relationship with others and join in the dance of Trinity.
