which means none are turned away from Christ's table. We believe Christ is fully present in the bread and wine, and no less present in our gluten-free and alcohol-free options. If you wish instead to receive a blessing, you may signify this by crossing your arms over your chest.

### We Welcome the Joy, Laughter, Sights, and Sounds of Children in Worship!

There are children's activity bulletins and worship activity bags available - just ask our ushers. If a moment out of the sanctuary is needed, a toy-filled nursery and changing table are available too, however, we ask that an adult family member stay present at all times.

### Affirmation of Baptism

In Holy Baptism, God makes promises to us, and we make promises to God. God's promise to us is an irrevocable "yes"; God claims us and calls us "Beloved," and there is nothing that can take away God's love for us. Secure in God's "yes," we make promises as well: to gather with the community of believers, to learn God's word and participate in the sacraments, to share the Good News of God's love, to follow Jesus' example in serving others, and to work for justice and peace in the world. Since Lutherans most often baptize infants, our parents and sponsors usually make these promises on our behalf. Confirmation is the time when a person claims these promises for themselves. Today, Zeah, Katie, and Payton affirm their baptismal promises, taking responsibility for continuing to learn and grow in their faith as a response to God's "yes" for them. As we celebrate with these siblings in Christ, may we all reaffirm our own commitment to walk in God's ways and work for God's Beloved Community.
