which means none are turned away from Christ's table. We believe Christ is fully present in the bread and wine, and no less present in our gluten-free and alcohol-free options. If you wish instead to receive a blessing, you may signify this by crossing your arms over your chest.

We Welcome the Joy, Laughter, Sights, and Sounds of Children in Worship!

There are children's activity bulletins and worship activity bags available - just ask our ushers. If a moment out of the sanctuary is needed, a toy-filled nursery and changing table are available too, however, we ask that an adult family member stay present at all times.

Kyrie & Canticle of Praise

At times during the year, our worship includes two liturgical songs near the beginning of the service: the Kyrie and the Canticle of Praise. The roots of these songs are found in scripture, and they have been used in Christian worship for centuries. The Greek phrase Kyrie Eleison, Christe Eleison, Kyrie Eleison means "Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy," and it was chanted in Christian worship as early as the fourth century. It is often paired with a Hymn of Praise, which traditionally is based on either Luke 2 ("Glory to God in the highest") or Revelation 5 ("This is the feast of victory for our God"). While these songs are not considered central to worship and are not always included in the liturgy, their use together reminds us that we can always bring our hurts and hopes to God, who cares deeply for us and provides for our every need.
