which means none are turned away from Christ's table. We believe Christ is fully present in the bread and wine, and no less present in our gluten-free and alcohol-free options. If you wish instead to receive a blessing, you may signify this by crossing your arms over your chest.

There are children's activity bulletins and worship activity bags available - just ask our ushers. If a moment out of the sanctuary is needed, a toy-filled nursery and changing table are available too, however, we ask that an adult family member stay present at all times.

Advent Candles

During the season of Advent, we light additional candles in worship. The candles in the Advent wreath are lit sequentially, one the first Sunday in Advent, two the second Sunday, and so on. Originally, the candles (and the paraments as well!) were purple, reflecting the penitential, preparatory nature of the season. As early as the twelfth century, some churches used blue for the season, and it became widespread in the 1960s, as the focus of the season began to shift from penitence to hope. The third candle is pink or rose colored, and the third Sunday in Advent is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin word for rejoice. There are a few traditions around the names of candles, some assigning them as the candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, and others naming them the Prophecy Candle, the Bethlehem Candle, the Shepherd's Candle, and the Angel's Candle. As we light these candles, we remember the promise of Christmas, and we prepare for Christ to come in our hearts, in our homes, and in our world.
