Pray for One Another—A Note from Pastor Amy Guida

All through out the New Testament (too many times to count), Christians are encouraged to pray for one another. And I suspect most of us in this congregation do pray a lot, and try to pray for other people. And it can be hard to know where to start. How do we pray for one another in this community? What do we even pray for? What are some ways to pray for someone without knowing them well? One way I have done this is by using the church directory, starting at the first page. Choosing 3-4 names, every day I would pray for these families, asking God to bring them Grace to bear any pain life throws their way; asking God to send them a spirit of Joy and Peace that is unshakable; and thanking God that they were in my congregation. As we prepare for the season of Lent, I encourage you all to get your hands on a directory and start with something simple. Meaningful Faith practices are made through actual practice, and praying for one another is an essential faith practice in any community.
